MEET THE BOARD: WILLIAM ("BILL") JOHNSON



As a member of the Board of Directors for the last seven years, Bill has seen the scope of services at Meals on Wheels, Etc. continue to expand to meet the needs of our senior population and kids' meals programs. The mission of our senior programs, to allow our seniors to remain independent, age gracefully, and be able to remain in their homes, is also a common theme with Bill's company, LifeCare of Florida Therapy Services ("LifeCare Therapy").

As the owner and manager of LifeCare Therapy, Bill and his staff of trained therapists

work with seniors throughout Central Florida, offering physical, occupational and speech therapy services, specializing in senior rehabilitation. "As our population ages, we have a duty to our seniors to keep them healthy and safe. Through senior programs like Meals on Wheels, Etc., and LifeCare Therapy we can help meet those responsibilities," says Bill. (Continued)

The Mission of Meals on Wheels Etc. is to enhance the quality of life for young and old by providing appetizing, nutritious meals as well as support for seniors which enable them to maintain their independence and dignity.

(Continued) As a Medicare Certified program, LifeCare Therapy works with over 200 seniors weekly, providing therapy services that allow their patients to remain active and safe. "Our senior programs address aging issues that all of us will face as we grow older, issue such as muscle weakness, impaired balance, walking difficulties, swallowing and safety concerns around the home with bathing/showering, climbing stairs and bathroom safety", Bill explains.

Bill attended Michigan State University and University of Central Florida earning a Bachelor's Degree in Business Marketing while working his way through school at Walt Disney World. Upon graduation, he started his business health care career, working for companies that managed therapy departments for hospitals, skilled nursing facilities and outpatient clinics across the country. Always interested in wanting to start his own company to meet the

needs of the aging population, Bill started LifeCare Therapy in 2003. Bill says, "What is great about LifeCare Therapy's senior services is that we provide those services to our patients either onsite at our clinic in historic Longwood, or we can travel offsite to our patients' homes for those having difficulty traveling to our clinic." In addition, LifeCare Therapy also contracts with home care agencies proving therapy services to their patients.

Bill believes that we need to continue the growth of senior programs. "As our 78 million baby boomers move into retirement age. It is imperative that we continue to support programs like Meals on Wheels, Etc." Bill is glad to be able to serve and support Meals on Wheels, Etc. for the last seven years and says, "With continued financial and volunteer support, we look forward to the expansion of programs we can continue to offer our seniors".

DR. PAUL AND MRS. CARMEN WILSON



Once a Marine, always a Marine! Paul enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1943. He saw extended combat in WW II, Korea and two tours in Vietnam. Wounded twice during his 35 years of service, he retired as a Colonel in 1977. After retirement from the Military, Paul and Carmen settled in Central Florida. Paul continued his graduate education, and for the next 20 years, he taught and directed a variety of programs

in Central Florida. He eventually became a full professor at the University of Orlando (which became Barry University) where he continued to teach until he retired in 2002.

As a military wife, Carmen worked with the Navy Relief Society wherever Paul was stationed. This would start her life-long commitment to helping families in need. Carmen would gather items (cribs, bikes, toys) and Paul would repair and refurbish them. Carmen always made sure that if someone needed anything, she would do her best to help.

When Paul retired from the military, Carmen worked for several years as an RN Instructor for Orange County Public schools. After a few years in the classroom, she was ready to start a new career and began working for Seniors First in Orlando, where she worked for the next seven years with seniors and their families. During her time at Seniors First, Carmen maintained a list of needy clients for whom she would seek donations. When the opportunity arose for a "Donations Coordinator" position at Better Living for Seniors (now Meals on Wheels, Etc.), Carmen was the perfect person for the job. She has been working with Meals on Wheels, Etc. since 1994. Although she does not have to work, she still enjoys being in the office part time. She continues to work with her many community contacts to secure donations for seniors in need. She says "That is my special way of helping the poor and needy. As one who knows that role, I feel most grateful to God, for allowing me to be in a position to help the poor and needy. It is my way of expressing gratitude".

Dr. Paul turned 89 and Carmen turned 82 this year. They are still having fun after 46 years of marriage and a lifetime of service to the community and country. Carmen and Paul Wilson are an inspiration to us all.
